Teacher Preparation Before School Visit

Classroom teachers have been asked to prepare students in advance.

- ◆ Classroom desks and chairs moved to perimeter of room to make space in the middle 教室の真ん中にスペースを開ける為に机と椅子を周囲に運ぶ
- ◆ Teacher distributes phrase sheets received from JIS coordinator カスタムの予習シートを先生が生徒に配布する
- ◆ Students practice phrases 生徒がカスタム表現を練習しておく

Preparation Before Class

- ◆ Ask teacher to set up PPT "Customs" カスタム PPT の設定を先生にお願いする
- ◆ For each goza set: 1 teapot, 3 toys, yunomi and chataku according to group size 各ござに:やかん1個、おもちゃ3個、人数分の湯呑みと茶たく
- ◆ Check Japanese level with teacher 日本語レベルを先生と確認する
- ◆ Check with teacher for presenting in English or Japanese プレゼン紹介を英語、または日本語でするか先生と確認する
- ◆ Check class size with teacher this will determine number of goza to set ござ設定の枚数を決める為に生徒人数を確認する

1. Visiting Your Teacher in Japan

- ◆ Leader and volunteers introduce themselves. JISの全員は日本 語で自己紹介する: お早うございます(こんにちは)。私の名前は、XXX です。宜しくお願いします。
- Q: What do you know about visiting houses in Japan? What is it polite to do? What is it impolite to do?

4. Japanese Entries - 玄関 - げんかん

Q: "How is a Japanese entry different from an American one?

Yes, the front door slides. When the door slides, the sound it makes is "Gara, gara, gara." Let's practice!

◆ Students practice "sliding" door and saying "Gara, gara, gara." 生徒は、手でドアを開ける真似しながら「ガラガラガラ」とブザーの「ピンポーン」を練習します。

Things to say ~

In Japan it is very important to bow when you greet someone. When we bow, we have a straight body from the hips. Men keep their hands at their side, and women put their hands in front when they bow.

11. カスタムポイント5: せいざ

"In Japan, we kneel when we first enter Zashiki."

"To make kneeling easier, overlap your toes and spread your heels."

◆ Make sure to tell class: JISリーダーがクラスに必ずお伝えください:
In Japan it is not polite to ask to sit more comfortably until you have given the omiyage and received tea or treats from your host.


12. Self-Introductions - 自己紹介 - じこしょうかい

"For practice, let's read all parts for now."

日本人のボランティアさんがセリフを一つ一つゆっくりと呼んで頂き、クラスが後について読む。

13. カスタムポイント6: おみやげ



"Please make sure to give the omiyage with both hands."

"As you hand the omiyage to your teacher, say: おみやげです。どうぞ。"

"When you receive anything to eat or drink in Japan, please say "いただきます" before drinking, and when you finish, please say "ごちそうさまでした"."

15. Conversation - 会話 - かいわ

"Now we can have some conversation!"

"Your teacher might ask you the first question."

"Please feel free to ask your teacher the other questions."

"For the 2nd question, put a noun in the blank. For example: 食べ物、スポーツ、動物"

"Let's practice the questions!"

16. Receiving Compliments - 褒められる

"Japanese people always receive a compliment humbly. So when your teacher compliments your Japanese today, please answer this way:"

「いえいえ、まだまだです!」

"And make sure to wave your hand in front of your face. This looks very humble!"

"OK? Let's practice!"

17. Leaving - 失礼する - しつれいする

"After a few minutes of conversation, the leader will tell the teacher it's time to leave."

"Your teacher will welcome you back, and you will say you enjoyed the tea."

"Please remember to greet your teacher as you put your shoes on and leave the house."

"Let's practice the conversation."

18. Phrases

"Here are all the phrases you will need for your visit today."

"Are there any questions about the presentation today?"

Once Introduction is Completed

- Do short demonstration with presentation leader and JIS volunteers.
- Tell class that each "visit" should take 8-10 minutes. When one visit is finished, choose a new leader and move to the next "house".
- Form groups of 4-5 students by numbering off in Japanese. (Limit: 5 groups)
- In large classes, groups may have 8 students.
- ◆ Once students are numbered, presentation leader goes to each goza and says: グループ 1 (2, 3, 4等) こちらへどうぞ。

Presentation Leader Responsibilities

- Keep track of timing for each visit.
- Eight to ten minutes into a visit, tell the class it's time to start wrapping up. At this point they should start their final greetings and putting on shoes.
- Try to finish all visits 5 minutes before end of class time for questions and comments.
